#### SECOND READING – NEW POLICY 1.211 COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRUSTEE'S LEADERSHIP TRAINING

**RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT:** That the Board of Trustees approves for a second reading the attached new policy 1.211, Community College Trustee's Leadership Training, which will be included in Chapter I, Board of Trustees, of the Policy Manual.

**BACKGROUND:** The proposed new policy is required by Public Act 99-0692. The new law includes requirements on the amount of training to be obtained by Trustees and the topics on which Trustees must be trained. Amongst others, training topics include open meetings law, ethics, and financial oversight and accountability audits. Board members' training completion must be published on the College's website and certification must be made to the Board Secretary. Training will be only recognized as meeting requirements if provided and/or approved by the Illinois Community College Board or Illinois Community College Trustees Association.

No additions or revisions have been made since Trustees approved the first reading during the April 24, 2017, regular meeting.

#### 1.211 Community College Trustee's Leadership Training (Adopted )

In accordance with <u>Public Act 99-0692</u>, trustees must complete a minimum of four hours of professional development leadership training during the first, third, and fifth year of his/her term covering topics that shall include, but are not limited to, open meetings law, community college and labor law, freedom of information law, contract law, ethics, sexual violence on campus, financial oversight and accountability, audits, and fiduciary responsibilities of a community college trustee. The College shall maintain on its website the names of all elected or appointed voting trustees of the board who have successfully completed the training, as well as the names of all elected or appointed voting trustees of the board who have not successfully completed the training, as required.

The board member shall certify completion of the required training to the secretary of the board. If a board member does not satisfy all requirements outlined above or the certification indicates that a board member has not completed the training, the secretary shall send a notice to all elected or appointed members serving on the board and the president or acting chief executive officer of the College of that fact.

In order for a community college trustee to obtain credit for training, the program must be offered by the Illinois Community College Trustees Association or a provider approved by the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB). ### APPOINTMENT SOCIOLOGY INSTRUCTOR

**RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT:** That the Board of Trustees approves the appointment of Dr. Julie Hartman-Linck as full-time Sociology Instructor in the Humanities, Social Sciences, and Fine Arts division beginning August 10, 2017, at an FY16 salary of \$86,997 (PhD, 9 years' experience), plus appropriate fringe benefits. Since the FY18 faculty union contract has not yet been negotiated, this salary is based on the FY16 salary schedule. This appointment will replace the sociology instructor position that will become available due to Kim Goudreau's retirement. This is a full-time faculty position and is within the FY18 budget.

BACKGROUND: Dr. Hartman-Linck currently works at Frostburg State University in Frostburg, Maryland, where she has been a full-time Associate Professor. She also is the Coordinator of the Women's Studies Program at Frostburg State University. Prior to Frostburg, Dr. Hartman-Linck was employed at Michigan State University where she was a graduate assistant and taught Introduction to Women's Studies. Julie has experience teaching both online and in-class formats. She has a strong knowledge of sociology, has taught courses within sociology and women's studies, and is able to teach other courses as well.

Dr. Hartman-Linck obtained her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology degree at Northern Illinois University and obtained her Ph.D. in Sociology from Michigan State University. Her research and publication record is within the field of gender and sexuality and her undergraduate specialization was in criminology. Dr. Hartman-Linck has started a new research project examining issues of stigma and support for pregnant women with addictions. She also is currently working with a student on an independent research project examining women and incarcerations, so she also has interest in the overlap of criminal justice, sociology, and social work.

Dr. Hartman-Linck is excited to teach at Highland Community College, especially because it brings her back to her home town of Freeport, and she looks forward to being a part of the future of our students. Julie's areas of specialization include gender, sexuality, identity, bisexual communities, qualitative methodologies, intersectionality, social inequalities and social justice.

We are pleased to have Dr. Hartman-Link join the Humanities, Social Sciences and Fine Arts division and look forward to her contributions to the Sociology department, division, and College.

#### <u>APPOINTMENT</u> SPANISH/ENGLISH INSTRUCTOR

**RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT:** That the Board of Trustees approves the appointment of Ms. Cristina Szterensus as full-time Spanish/English Instructor in the Humanities, Social Sciences, and Fine Arts division beginning August 10, 2017, at an FY16 salary of \$100,466 (MA+60, 27 years' experience), plus appropriate fringe benefits. Since the FY18 faculty union contract has not yet been negotiated, this salary is based on the FY16 salary schedule. This appointment will replace the Spanish/English instructor position that will become available due to Kent Johnson's retirement. This is a full-time faculty position and is within the FY18 budget.

BACKGROUND: Ms. Szterensus currently works at Rock Valley College (RVC) in Rockford, Illinois, where she has been a full-time Professor of Spanish. Ms. Szterensus teaches beginner and intermediate Spanish. Ms. Szterensus has experience conducting assessment at class level, as well as the program level. Cristina has helped expand RVC's offerings with new classes such as Spanish for heritage speakers and Latin American Cultural expressions, an interdisciplinary humanities class that explores issues of different Latin American countries, which has a class trip component, as well. Prior to RVC, Ms. Szterensus was Instructor of Spanish at Northern Illinois University in DeKalb, Illinois, where she taught all levels of Spanish, including advanced linguistics, advanced grammar, and conversation classes. She is familiar with designing curriculum for classes. Ms. Szterensus taught English and Spanish at Kellogg Community College in Battle Creek, Michigan as well.

Ms. Szterensus completed her Bachelor's degree in English at Instituto Superior del Profesorado, Joaquín V. González in Buenos Aires, Argentina. She also completed a specialization degree in Foreign Language Teaching Methodology at Instituto Nacional Superior del Profesorado, Joaquín V. González. Mr. Szterensus holds three Master's degrees from Northern Illinois University in DeKalb, Illinois – MA Spanish, MA Communications, and MA English.

Cristina showed mastery of Spanish and English through her interview, teaching demonstrations, student evaluations and supervisor evaluations. Her background, experience, education and community engagement make her an excellent addition to Highland Community College. We are looking forward to Cristina joining Highland Community College.

#### <u>APPOINTMENT</u> MATHEMATICS INSTRUCTOR

**RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT:** That the Board of Trustees approves the appointment of Mr. James Morgan as full-time Mathematics Instructor in the Natural Science and Mathematics division beginning August 10, 2017, at an FY16 salary of \$52,118 (MS+0, 1 year experience), plus appropriate fringe benefits. Since the FY18 faculty union contract has not yet been negotiated, this salary is based on the FY16 salary schedule. This is a full-time faculty position and is within the FY18 budget.

**BACKGROUND:** Mr. Morgan currently works at Joliet Junior College in Joliet, Illinois, where he has been a full-time Math Placement Specialist, as well as an adjunct Mathematics Instructor. Mr. Morgan has taught a wide range of courses which includes intermediate algebra, college algebra, pre-calculus, discrete math, calculus, and differential equations. In his position as Math Placement Specialist, he has advised students concerning degree requirements and math courses, addressed student concerns for the Mathematics department, assisted with development of placement policies and alternative remedial pathways, and worked with a variety of other departments at the College, in addition to the Mathematics Department.

Mr. Morgan obtained his Bachelor of Arts degree in Mathematics, as well as his Master of Science in Mathematics, from Governors State University in University Park, Illinois.

James brings community college teaching experience and has had extensive work advising a diverse population of students. He is very student-centered and works hard to engage his students in the classroom. We are pleased to have Mr. Morgan join the Natural Science and Mathematics division and look forward to him joining Highland Community College.

• We have now received the 2016 tax year tax computation reports from all four counties. EAV changes from tax year 2015 to 2016 by county are as follows:

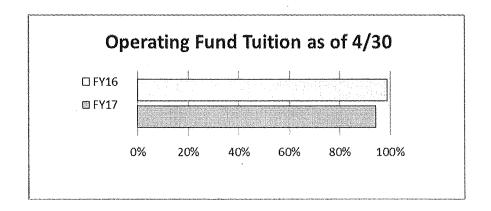

Overall, the total District increase in EAV is 1.6%. We had budgeted for an increase of 1.0%, which will result in our actual property tax revenue being about \$17,000 more than budgeted.

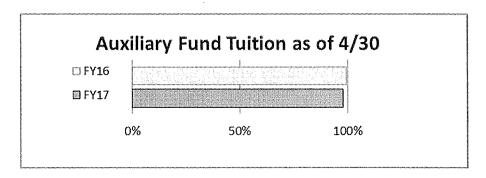

- Current Results as of Month End: The following charts shows the comparison of the FY17 financial results for various items, as labeled, to FY16 results as of April 30<sup>th</sup>. The FY16 bar is the year-to-date results as of April 30th, 2016 divided by the actual year end esults for FY16. The FY17 bar is the year-to-date results for April 30, 2017, divided by the annual budgeted amount for FY17.
- It should be noted that the April finance report for the period ending March 31, 2017 erroneously included tuition revenue for the Summer 2017 semester for those funds which include tuition revenue. Revenue for the Summer semester is recorded in the year in which classes are held (FY18 in this case).



Operating Fund tuition revenue appears to be about 4% lower than anticipated at this point in time. If Operating Fund tuition revenue is 4% lower than budgeted for the fiscal year that amounts to about \$218,000.



Auxiliary Fund tuition revenue appears to be about 2% lower than anticipated at this point in time. If Auxiliary Fund tuition revenue is 2% lower than budgeted for the fiscal year that amounts to about \$5,000.
