The HCC Foundation Board of Directors has named Jeff Reinke of Winnebago as the incoming Executive Director of the HCC Foundation. Reinke will serve with retiring Executive Director Jim Berberet during a transitional period into the Fall 2017 Semester.

Reinke will be responsible for developing and executing fundraising programs which benefit the College and its support of students, according to Todd Weegens, President of the Foundation Board of Directors.

Reinke has more than 35 years of not-for-profit experience and recently served as Assistant Vice President of Major Gifts for the Alexian Brothers Foundation and AMITA Health in Chicago, where he oversaw the Major Gifts program for a \$28 million Behavioral Health Campaign.

Previously, he served as the Fox River Valley Regional Foundation Director for Presence Health, where he managed fundraising for Presence St. Joseph Hospital in Elgin and Presence Mercy Medical Center in Aurora. He also managed fundraising efforts for the Rockford Region ministries, including Presence Saint Joseph's in Freeport.

Reinke holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Journalism and Marketing from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh. He resides in Winnebago with his wife Chris, who is a special education teacher for the Winnebago School District. They have five children ranging in age from 22 to 32 and three grandchildren. His interests include his family, biking, travel, and love for the game of basketball, which he has coached, played and watched his children for more than 25 years.

### Bearing Fruit: The Partnership Between HCC Foundation and Highland's Agriculture Program

he HCC Foundation continues to work closely with Justin Ebert, Highland's agriculture instructor, as the HCC Ag program continues to thrive. Enrollment growth in the program has warranted the recent hiring of a second full-time agriculture instructor, Monica Pierce. The second instructor will not only share the teaching load with Mr. Ebert and a few adjunct (part-time) instructors, but will also be charged with coordinating the new "college farm" which will be an integral part of the program's curriculum.

Since the fall of 2014, support from local farm bureaus, agrelated businesses, banks, and individual farmers has been instrumental in fueling much-needed program enhancements of the Highland Community College Agriculture program, especially in terms of technology, equipment, delivery of instruction, and co-curricular activities. Donations in support of Highland Ag have funded such initiatives and items as:

- Dairy Judging Team
- Ag Club/Post-secondary Ag Students (PAS) activities
- Ag program test plot activities
- Scholarship for AAS (2-yr non-transfer degree) in some specific trades, including Agriculture Management



- Purchase of unmanned aerial vehicle (drone) and related iPads & other technology
- Equipment for soil science lab
- Surveying equipment for Ag mechanics & soils classes
- Equipment and supplies for crop science plant lab
- General donations to the program, which are combined with other gifts for larger-scale projects

The changes afoot would certainly be impossible without the generosity of our local donors. In fact, the funds to establish the second instructor

position and to (soon) establish the "Northwest Illinois Agriculture Center" are the result of a sizable pledge from a longtime member of the local agriculture community, who wishes to remain anonymous. As the Highland Ag program embarks on its next phase, continued and expanded support will be needed.
