### APPOINTMENT STUDENT ADVISOR (GRANT FUNDED)

**RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT:** That the Board of Trustees approves the appointment of Ms. Kerstin Curry as a full-time Student Advisor, Project Succeed beginning September 2, 2024, at an FY25 salary of \$46,336, plus appropriate fringe benefits. This is a full-time, exempt professional, grant-funded position and is within the FY25 budget. This position is dependent on continued grant funding.

BACKGROUND: Ms. Curry has been with Highland Community College as a Student Information Specialist since Spring 2021. In her current role, she assists students by providing account login information, answering enrollment and admission inquiries, and offering guidance on the course registration process. Additionally, she serves as the coordinator for the Curriculum, Advising, and Program Planning (CAPP) system, where she updates degrees and certificates in Banner for degree checks and audits, and processes course substitutions. Ms. Curry has also been the designated school official for international students, supporting them through the college application process, I-20 issuance, and school transfers. Prior to joining Highland Community College, Ms. Curry worked for several years in medical administration. She served as an Operations Leader in Specialty Clinics for FHN and held various roles at Advocate Medical Group (AMG). During her tenure at AMG, she held positions such as Coordinator of Practice Services and Occupational Health, Occupational Health Lead Scheduler, and Occupational Health Assistant.

Ms. Curry is currently pursuing a Bachelor of General Studies degree at Illinois State University, in Normal, Illinois, with an anticipated graduation of Spring 2025.

Her extensive experience in guiding, motivating, and assisting students throughout their educational journey makes her an invaluable asset at Highland Community College. Her motivated, efficient, and approachable demeanor fosters strong rapport with students.

Ms. Curry's continued passion for supporting students in their educational paths positions her as an excellent addition to the Project Succeed Program.

### <u>USE OF AGENCY FUND</u> FOR SPORTS CENTER REPAIRS AND REPLACEMENTS

**RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT:** That the Board of Trustees approves the use of Agency funds for the cost of repairs to the Sports Center, including replacement of the air handler controller, removal and replacement of the boiler, and air conditioning repairs in an amount not to exceed \$33,499. Funds for this purpose are available through the Agency funds.

**BACKGROUND:** Several large expenditures for repairs and maintenance to the Sports Center have occurred throughout the fiscal year. The failure of the controller in the Sports Center automation system made it not possible to schedule lighting or heating/air conditioning. The boiler was replaced due to its age and issues such as leaking and corrosion. The air conditioner fan assembly needed to be replaced. This will be included in the FY24 financial transactions for the College. The YMCA Board of Directors has approved the expense.

### **USE OF AGENCY FUND INTEREST**

**RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT:** That the Board of Trustees approves the use of Agency funds interest in the amount of \$102,250 to replenish the Agency Fund reserve, which supports the cost of repairs to the Sports Center.

BACKGROUND: As part of the HCC – YMCA Agreement, the College and the YMCA contribute to a reserve fund, called the Agency Fund, on an annual basis. The funds are used to share the cost of major improvements and replacements to the building on a 50/50 allocation. Several large expenditures for repairs and maintenance to the Sports Center have occurred throughout the fiscal year, depleting the Agency Fund reserve. The interest earned on the Agency Funds has accumulated in a separate reserve and has amounted to \$102,250 over time. The Agreement allows for the interest to be shared equally by each party, meaning \$51,125 would be allocated to each. This allocation would replenish the Agency Fund reserve and be used as it has in the past, in keeping with the Agreement.

BACKGROUND: The Auxiliary Enterprises Fund includes as a revenue source the J. Rosemary Shockey Bookstore, the per credit hour student activity fee, the cafeteria, ticket sales for athletic and certain Fine Arts events, as well as miscellaneous revenue collected by student organizations and activities. Expenses in the Auxiliary Enterprises Fund include costs to operate the bookstore and cafeteria, as well as costs of athletic teams, certain Fine Arts events and clubs, student government and clubs, academic teams, and student activities. This transaction will be included in the College's fiscal year 2024 financial records.
