Growth and Success

Highland Community College has served as an academic leader, cultural beacon, and economic driver since its founding in 1962 by visionaries who recognized the potential of a comprehensive two-year institution in northwestern Illinois. Originally named Freeport Community College and offering late afternoon and evening courses at Freeport High School for just 300 students, Highland has grown to encompass an expansive campus with more than 2,000 students. Nearly 60 years later, we continue strengthening our legacy and have become one of the premier community colleges in the state, currently ranked seventh out of 48 peer colleges state-wide.

As a community college, our mission is built around meeting the needs of our greater northwest Illinois community through quality educational and cultural programs.

In addition to offering comprehensive academic programming with over 70 degrees and certificates, Highland is a beacon of cultural opportunity. Our theatre, arts, music, literature and lecture series are popular throughout the area. And our Cougars have a strong record of athletic successes.

YOUR COMMUNITY

Changes and Challenges

Highland Community College is committed to our student-centered philosophy of learning and the priorities outlined in our 2017-2022 Strategic Plan, which build on our well-established history of success. A recent economic impact study by the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) states that Illinois community colleges boost the economy of their local communities by generating billions of dollars in state and federal income tax revenues and in local sales and wages. Community college graduates fill 48,000 jobs for major employers and advance the state's goal of 60 percent of adults with a college degree of marketable credential by the year 2025.



Like other community colleges in Illinois and across the country, Highland Community College serves multiple missions that include workforce training, remediating students in preparation for higher education, and community enrichment. However, the ability of Highland and our peer schools to deliver on these missions is being challenged by an economic landscape that has been dramatically altered by the recent economic crisis and by changing demographics.

Specific challenges are:

- Traditional funding model (1/3 state, 1/3 local taxes, 1/3 student tuition) no longer viable due to declining state support. Though serving over 67 percent of all higher education students, Illinois community colleges now receive less than 13 percent of total funding allocated for higher education
- Increased reliance on local tax revenues.
 Declining state support which limits access to underserved residents
- Declining base of K-12 students in our region which will likely cause a 10 percent decline in traditional students over the next 10 years Public transportation challenges for residents commuting within our large geographic district
- Increased demand for online, accelerated and weekend programs which require greater flexibility
- The majority of Highland's student population need some transitional coursework such as math, English or reading preparation prior to enrolling in college-level courses

YOUR FUTURE

The Vision

Highland Community College is committed to being a premier academic choice and a catalyst for economic vitality within our region for generations to come, offering greater access to innovative and experiential learning for both the traditional and non-traditional student. When visionary leaders like past HCC Foundation Board member Delbert Scheider launched the Acres for Education Campaign to create the college over 50 years ago, the college became a reality. Now, this campaign is needed to keep us relevant and to continue the legacy created by our founders. As a vital provider and partner, Highland Community College is shaping the future of northwestern Illinois by providing exceptional, transformational, educational experiences and outcomes.

The Legacy Campaign is focused on the following key funding priorities:

- Providing an exceptional student experience Enhancing student engagement
- Expanding partnerships in career, technical and trades
- Increasing student-athlete participation
- Growing vital academic programs and partnerships



Our goal is to raise a total of \$4 million to support these priorities which include facility and laboratory upgrades; technical equipment; programming support; and scholarships.

SOLID **PILLARS** TO **BUILD A STRONG FUTURE**





Business, Technology and Agriculture

This division offers a diverse spectrum of business, career and technical and agriculture programs, and opportunities to pursue internships and other experiential learning opportunities. Programs such as Agriculture, Industrial Manufacturing, Welding and Electronics are in high demand, and we are expanding our partnerships with area employers such as Chrysler Automotive. Major needs include technical equipment, lab renovations and upgrades, plus a utility tractor and planter with precision technology.

Humanities, Social Sciences and Fine Arts

This vital academic division is growing with the introduction of new programs such as Mass Communication. Criminal Justice and the nationally respected Leadership Institute and Leadership Forum. Priority needs include a theater projection system, instruments and communications equipment; a deeper investment in faculty and globally recognized speakers; and more scholarships and tuition waivers.

Natural Science and Mathematics

This division houses a variety of programs: Biology, Chemistry Engineering, Environmental Science, Geology, Mathematics, Physics, and Pre-Professional (Chiropractic, Medicine, Pharmacy, and Veterinary). Remodels of learning spaces and updated curricula have been a top priority, with large-scale renovations still needed for the Biology and Environmental Science labs. Recruitment and retention efforts for STEM programs help increase demand and raise student engagement opportunities.

Nursing

Nursing is one of Highland's strongest and fastest growing departments with a conceptbased curriculum preparing students to be critical thinkers from day one and providing an exceptional experience. This department offers 4-year and part-time nursing programs, medical assistant, phlebotomy and nursing assistant programs, and a new focus on online learning and simulation products. Among the greatest needs are a simulation hospital, a Sim Mom, and a Lab/Sim coordinator position.

Student Services and Development

This division touches every Highland student and is critical to **student engagement** and retention. It offers a wide range of services, including advising, career services, counseling, behavioral intervention, disability services, para-professional and peer tutoring, mentoring, and student activities and clubs. Priority needs are consolidating student services in an upgraded welcome center, establishing endowed funds for student programming outside the classroom, and a continued investment to the HCC HOPE Fund, an emergency student relief fund.
